

PLANT field guide

London Plane Tree Platanus x acerifolious

When to look:

Leaves and flowers appear in early spring, fuits appear after flowering


Similar species:

American Sycamore (*Platanus occidentalis*): its fruiting balls usually appear individually (not in pairs) and its leaf lobes are wider than they are long.

Oriental Plane Tree (*Platanus orientalis*): its fruiting balls appear in groups of 3 - 5 and its leaf lobes are deeply incised and much longer than they are wide. Deciduous tree that grows 15-30 m in height

Mottled grey-brown and creamy white bark

Leaves are 10-25 cm in width with 3-5 lobes and slightly serrated edges



Red or yellow flowers in small rounded clusters 'Fuzzy' round fruting ball that turn from green to brown when ripe
