## Native Morning-glory or Poison Morning-glory Ipomoea muelleri

When to look: March to December

Lilac or pink flowers that are funnel or trumpet shaped

Heart-shaped dark green leaves

Grows up to 3 m wide

Sprawling perennial ground cover

## Similar species:

Related to the bush potato (*lpomoea costata*), a twining shrub up to about 2 m tall which grows in rocky outcrops near Dampier and further inland. Flowers are up to 4 cm in length and 5 cm in diameter
